# **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT Report No. TPW-2021-0020, dated May 28, 2021, regarding the Uniform Traffic Control By-law 84-01 – 40 km/h Area Speed Limits, Schedule Amendment, be received;

AND FURTHER THAT the amendment to the Schedule "23" Rates of Speed – Signs on Display of the Uniform Traffic Control By-law No. 84-01 be adopted by Council.

# **BACKGROUND:**

Report No. TPW-2021-0014 discussed the implementation of the 40 km/h Area Speed Limit Pilot Project. The Uniform Traffic Control By-law (UTCB) 84-1 Schedule "23" Rates of Speed – Signs on Display schedule amendment is required before the new 40 km/h area speed limit signs are installed in the neighbourhood areas.

Report TPW-2021-0007, the 2021 Traffic Engineering Workplan, has included this pilot project as one of the priorities to be completed this year.

# COMMENTS:

The following roads will have the speed limits reduced from 50 km/h to 40 km/h, as part of the 40 km/h Area Speed Limit Pilot Project:
