## Confederation Street Neighbourhood Traffic Calming Comments and Questions Summary

- Confederation Street between Wildwood Road / Main Street and Ninth Line
  - Speed Hump near #98 to be moved further north
    - Will be moved a few meters to the north
  - Sidewalk Facilities Safety concerns for pedestrians
  - Bicycle Facilities
  - Extend the Flashing 40 km/h School Zone on Confederation
  - Reduce Speeds to 40 km/h
  - Why go through this process when speed humps have been proven to work?
  - Unhappy with the speed hump will move from the Glen
  - Regular Police Enforcement
  - Happy to see the Town take a step in the right direction but more is needed
  - Automated Speed Enforcement
- Confederation Street between Mountainview Road N and Wildwood Road / Main Street
  - Reduce Speed Limit to 40 km/h
  - More speed humps than what is currently proposed
  - Start listening to the taxpayers
  - Automated Speed Enforcement
  - More Police presence and enforcement
  - Implement in 2022 not 2023
- Wildwood Road between Ontario Street and Confederation Street / Main Street
  - Add a speed hump near end of hill and Erin Street
    This has been added to the plan
  - Town keeps installing measures and removing them (Flexible Bollards)
  - Speed humps are needed, non-intrusive measures do not work
  - Increase speed limit on Wildwood to 50 km/h
  - A resident from Oakridge Drive not in support of speed humps
  - $\circ$  Happy to see the Town taking action but more is needed

- Delivery vehicles stopping on the road forcing traffic to go around
- Unsafe to cross the street
- Unsafe to come out of driveways
- Automated Speed Enforcement
- Implement this now
- Eighth Line between 22 Side Road and Wildwood Road
  - Pedestrian Facilities unsafe for pedestrians and cyclists
  - Speeds too high, speed humps and enforcement needed
  - Speed humps are not a good idea as they will impede with Farm vehicles
  - Noise pollution from vehicles
  - Automated Speed Enforcement
- Main Street between Prince Street and 22 Side Road
  - Concerns:
    - Speeding
    - Noise Pollution
    - Truck traffic
    - Vehicles from outside the Glen using as by-pass
    - Pedestrian Safety
    - Cyclist safety
    - Vehicles not stopping at Stop sign on Mountain Street
    - Speed too high in front of Glen William School
    - Issues with vehicles parking when dropping off and picking up children from school
    - Not enough parking for businesses
    - Deteriorating road
    - Safety concerns crossing to go to the park due to the curve
    - The proposed plan will not be effective
  - Requested:
    - More speed humps
      - Additional speed hump added after the last bridge
    - Constant Police presence and enforcement
    - Pedestrian facilities
    - Road reconstruction

- Provide and explanation as to how we will address the concerns and justify every single recommended measure and how it will be of benefit
- Implement the plan right away not in 2023, be proactive
- Increase safety around the school
- Pavement markings narrowing the road
- Permanent Vehicle Activated Traffic Calming Signs (VATCS)
