
About Our District

- Emphasizes the importance of creating a workforce that reflects the community we serve and is sensitive to the needs of our diverse region.



DRU Impact


- Responded to 2200 calls for service







Total of 115 reported missing in 2022 and all located. (69 from Milton / 46 from HH)






Vehicle Thefts





Catalytic Converter Thefts



- July 25th 2022
- Three male suspects in disguise demanded narcotics
- Suspects fled in a stolen car that was involved in a collision shortly after
- Investigators authored several search warrants and identified one suspect
- In December 2022, investigators tracked down the suspect and arrested him for robbery

- Suspect committing extensive B&Es and thefts of offroad vehicles, motorcycles and construction equipment in North Halton
- CIB developed Project Timbur to identify and apprehend the suspect. Intelligence driven by uniform officers
- March 1st 2022, 20+ officers executed 6 search warrants and recovered over \$280,000 worth of stolen property
 - Suspect arrested and over 30 criminal charges laid

- Catalytic converter thefts increased from 34 in 2021 (1 Dist only) to 100 in 2022. In 2021, we solved 32% of these thefts
- Investigators developed Project Decibel and teamed up with Equite and Cumis General Insurance. Bait vehicle secured along with cameras.
- Numerous search warrants executed and ended with 81% being solved.

Mental Health Response

Mobile Rapid Response Team (MCRRT)

- Partnership with St Joe's Hospital (Hamilton)
- Officer & Mental Health Professional (RN/SW)
- Priority is to divert away from the hospital

Crisis Intervention Training

- Course focusing on de-escalation of mental health incidents
- Every frontline member will receive this training within first three years



Hate Crime Reporting

- Collaborative approach to incidents of hate in our community
- Internal Hate Crime Working group
- Immediate victim follow up and support
- All members received Hate Crime Investigative Training
- Halton Hills: 6 Incidents in 2022 (7 in 2021)
- Halton Region: 78 in 2022 (64 in 2021)





Opioid Strategy

- Partnership with Regional Health -outreach and prevention.
 Coordination of enforcement, investigative and response strategies.
- Emergency response officers carry Narcan nasal spray to use as an emergency treatment that temporarily reverses the side effects from suspected opioid overdoses.

Number of times Narcan administered by HRPS:

- 2020 **–** 25
- 2021 34
- 2022 31
- 2023 12 to date (4 in 1 District)
