




Introduction

What is Culture Days?

- 3-week national celebration of arts and culture
- Raises the profile of the local cultural sector
- Expands access to cultural activities through free diverse programming for all
- Increases year-round participation in arts and culture
- Attracts tourists who contribute to the local economy







Why is Culture Days Important?

Culture Days offers an event framework that is:

- inclusive
- accessible
- builds community
- supports local

Positive impacts for activity organizers:

- new audiences, clients, volunteers and/or board members
- new programs and services
- partnerships and business relationships formed leading to financial savings, increased profile
- program delivery and event skill development
- building internal organizational capacity





Culture Days in Halton Hills

Since 2018, Town Staff have supported artists, cultural groups, and creative businesses to host 350 Culture Days events for nearly 14,000 residents and visitors.


