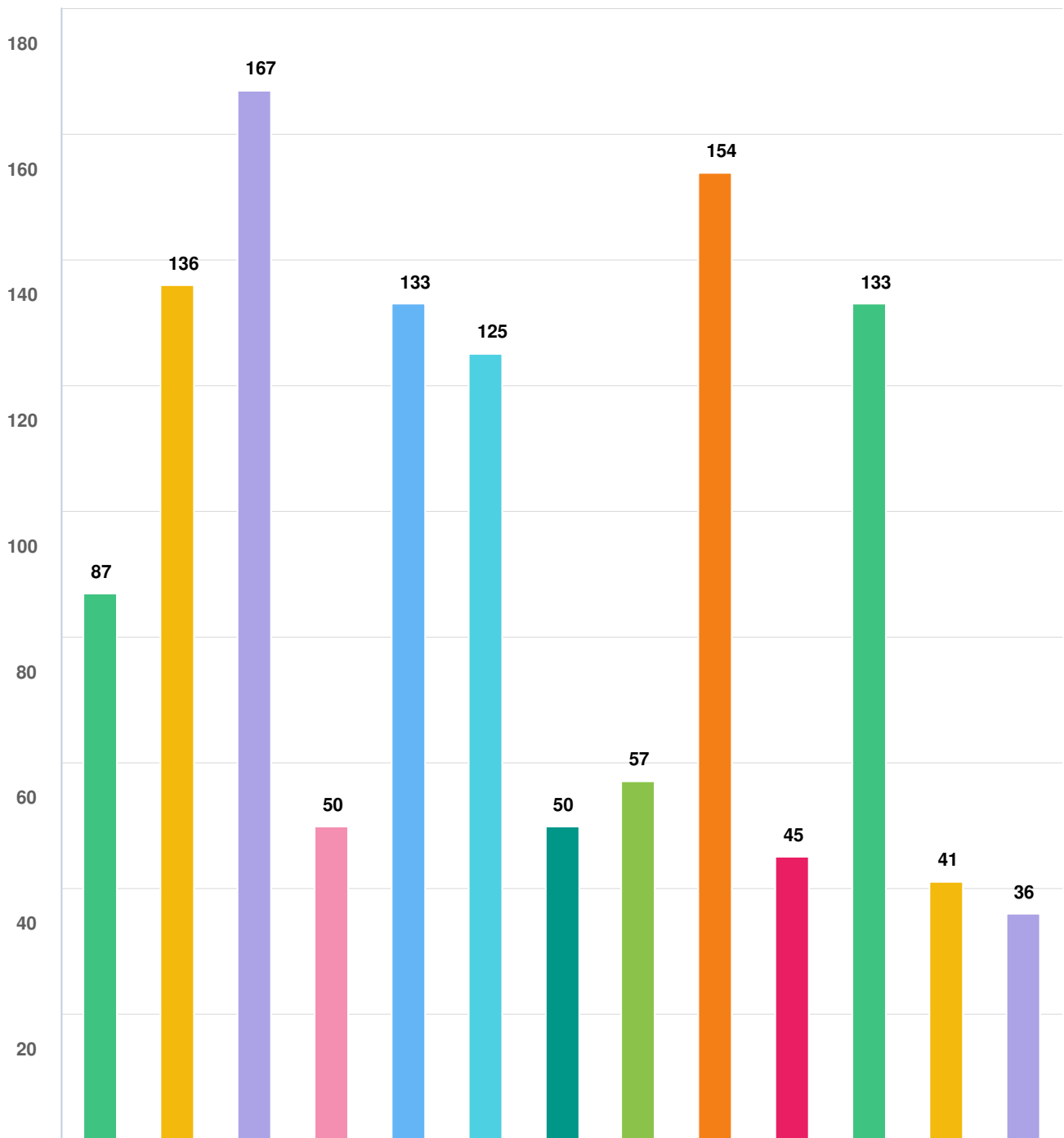

Q1 What features are you most looking forward to in the Preferred Park Concept (pick 3).

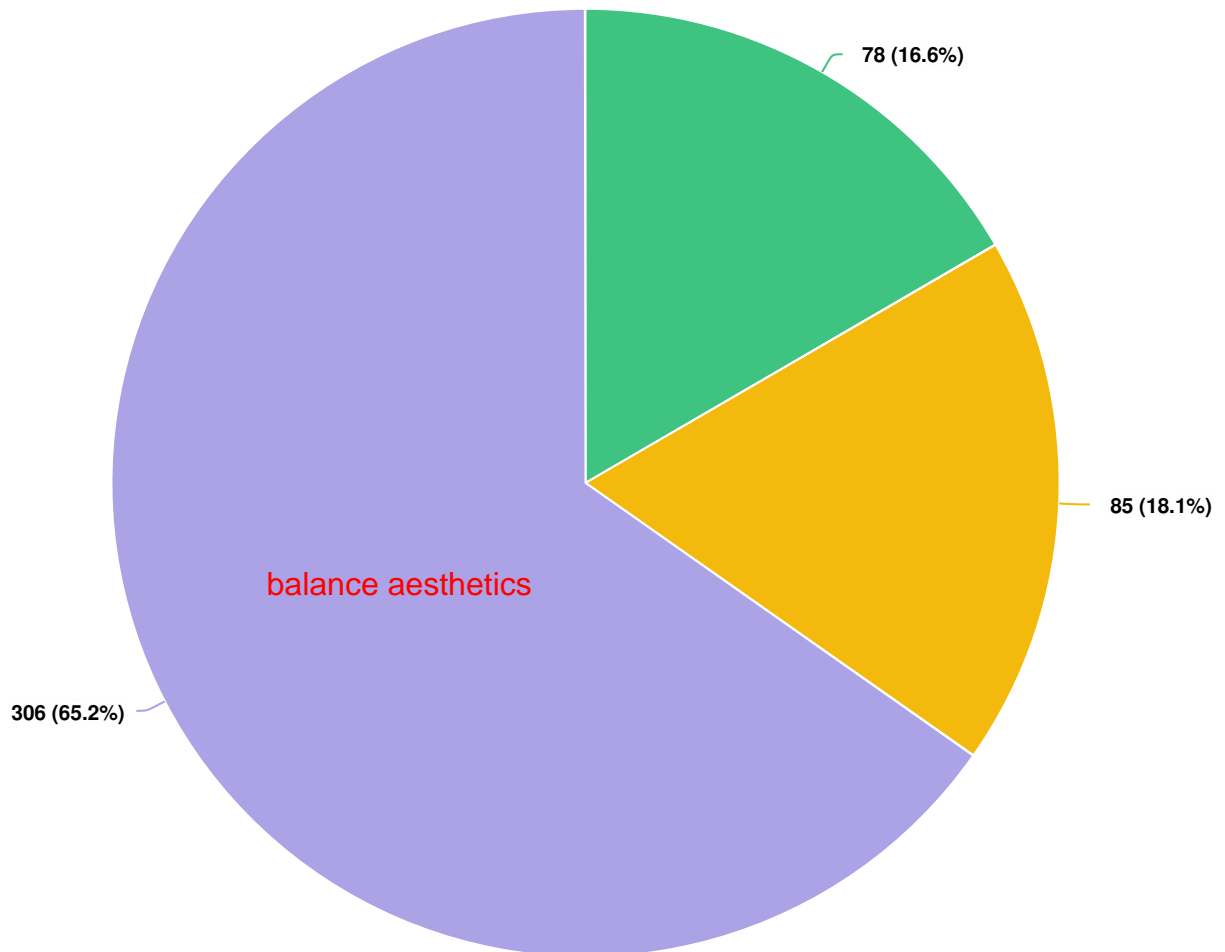

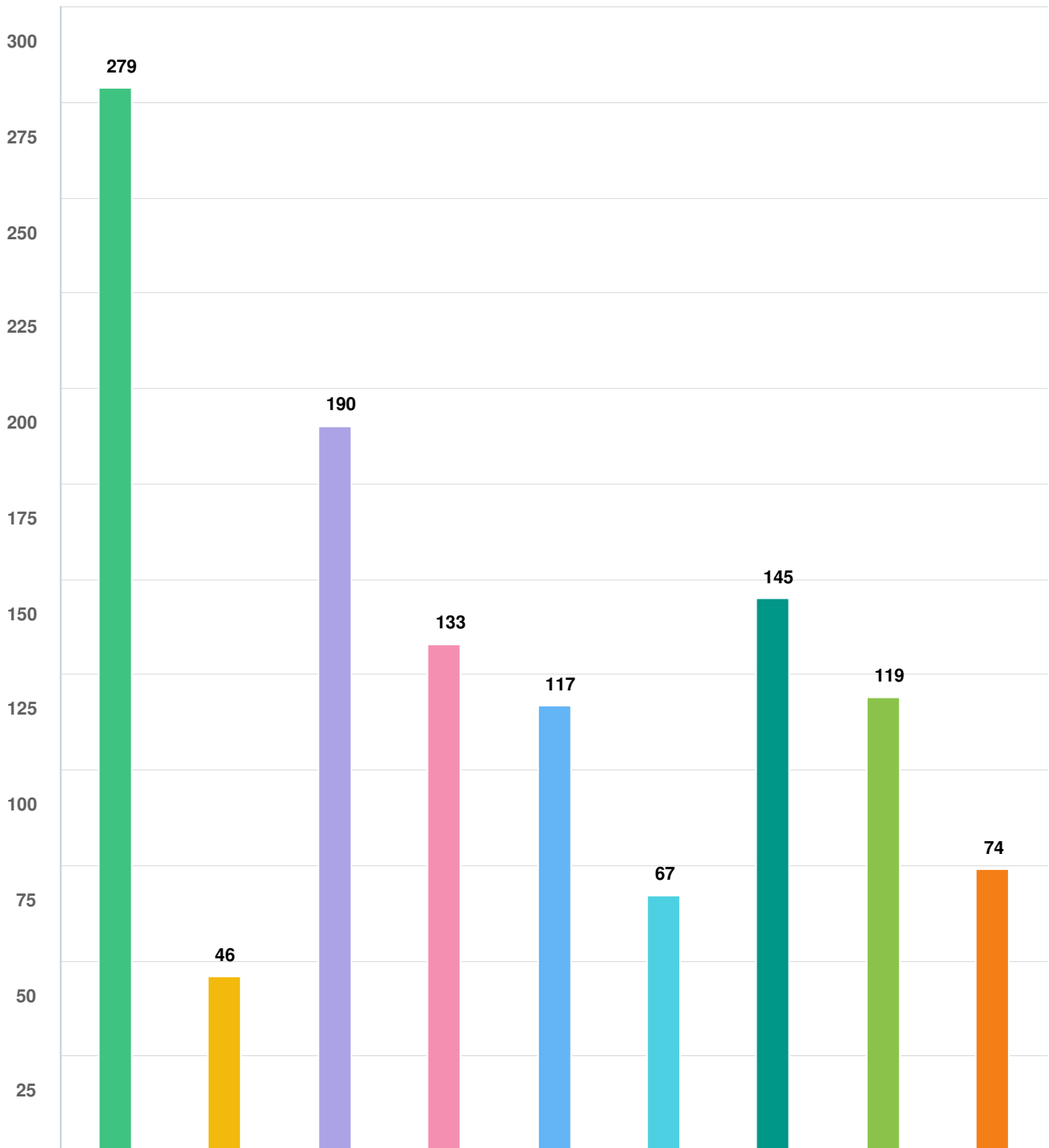

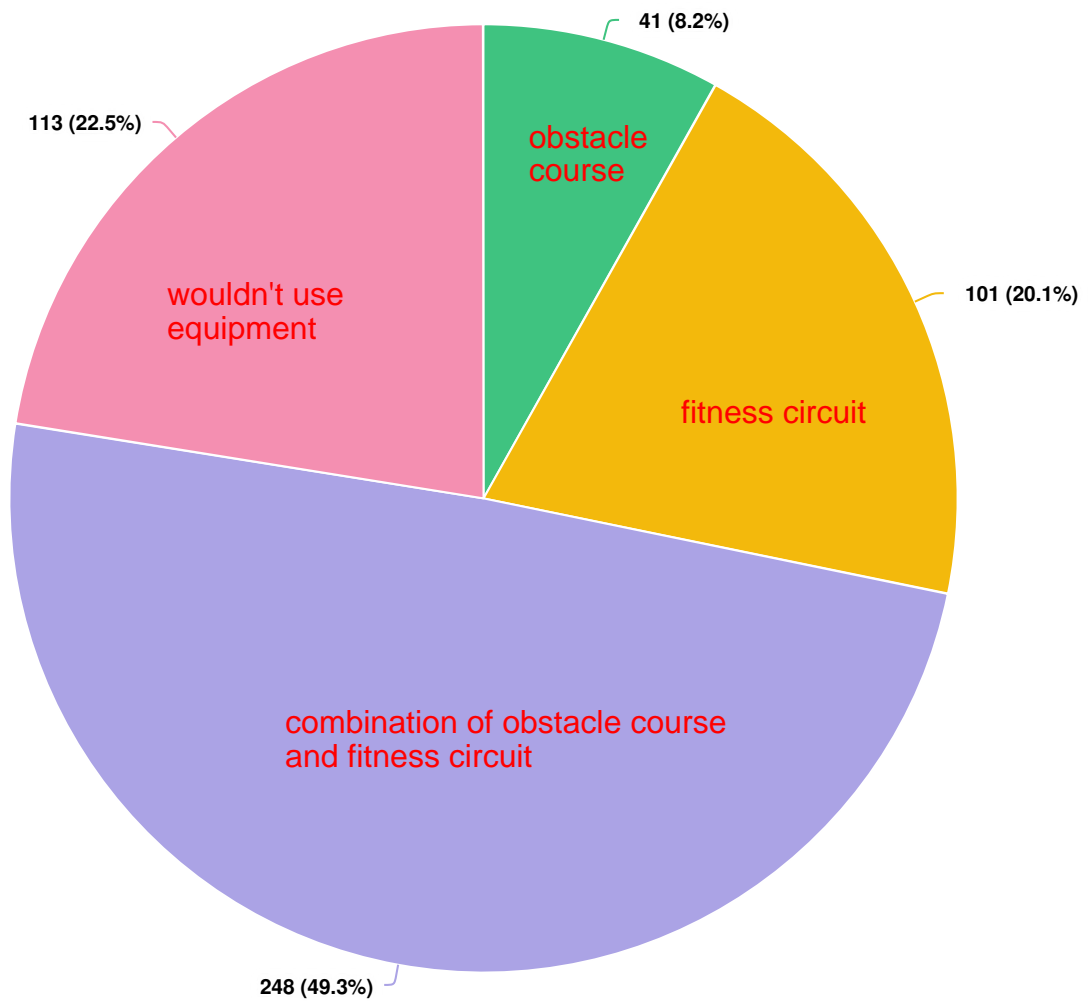

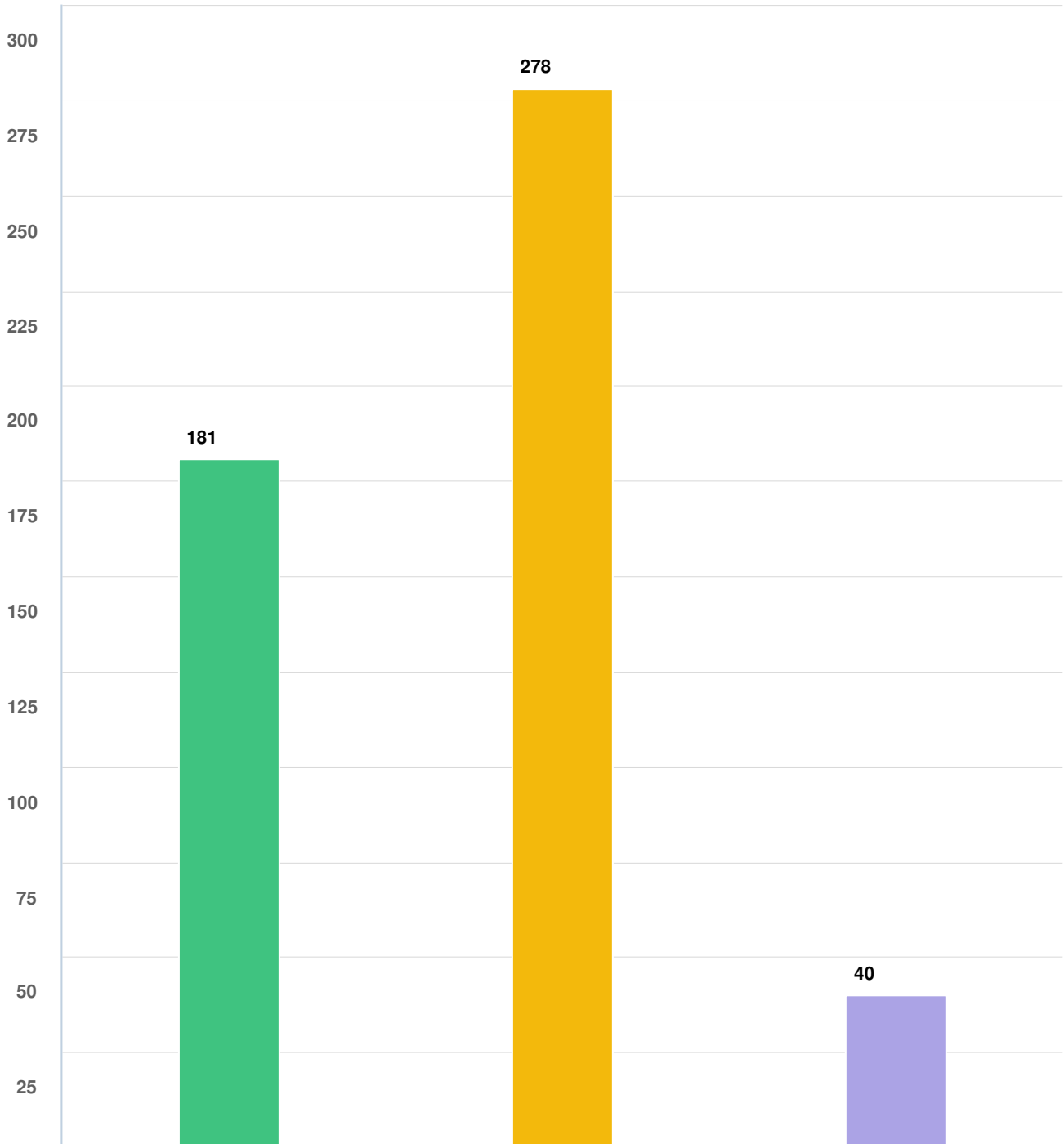

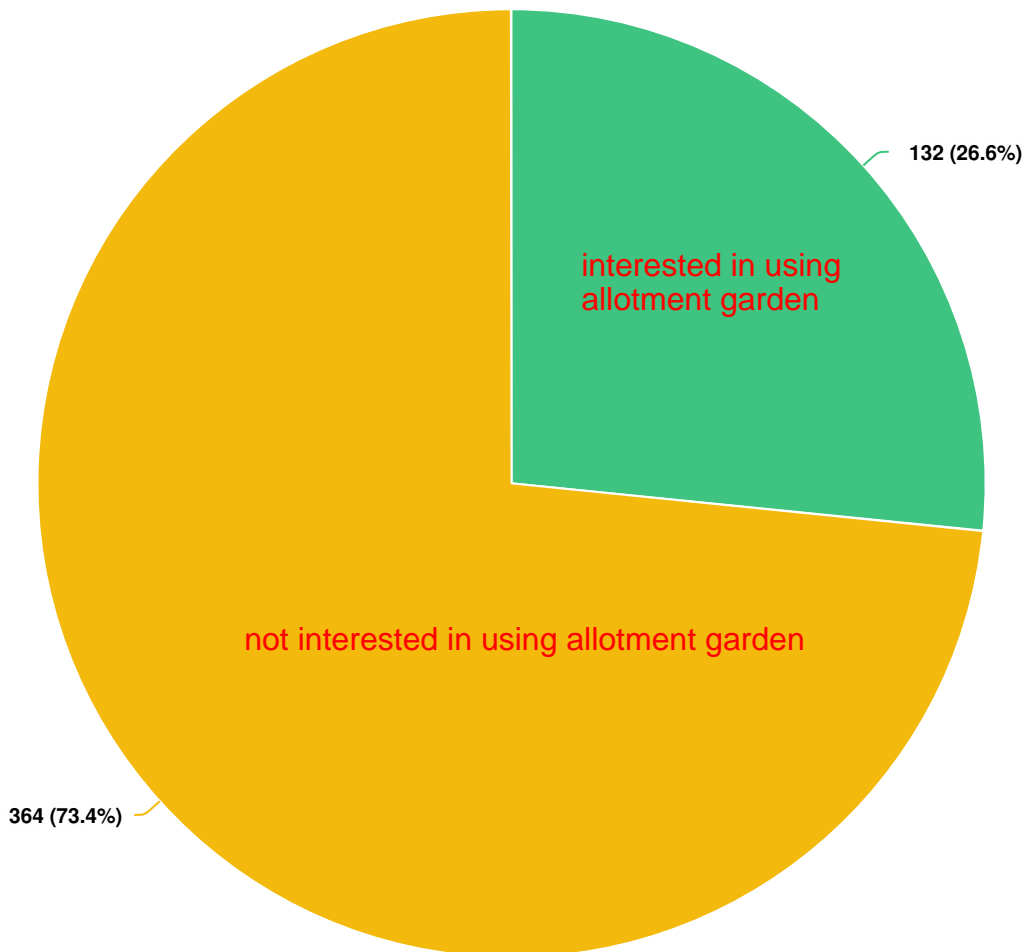

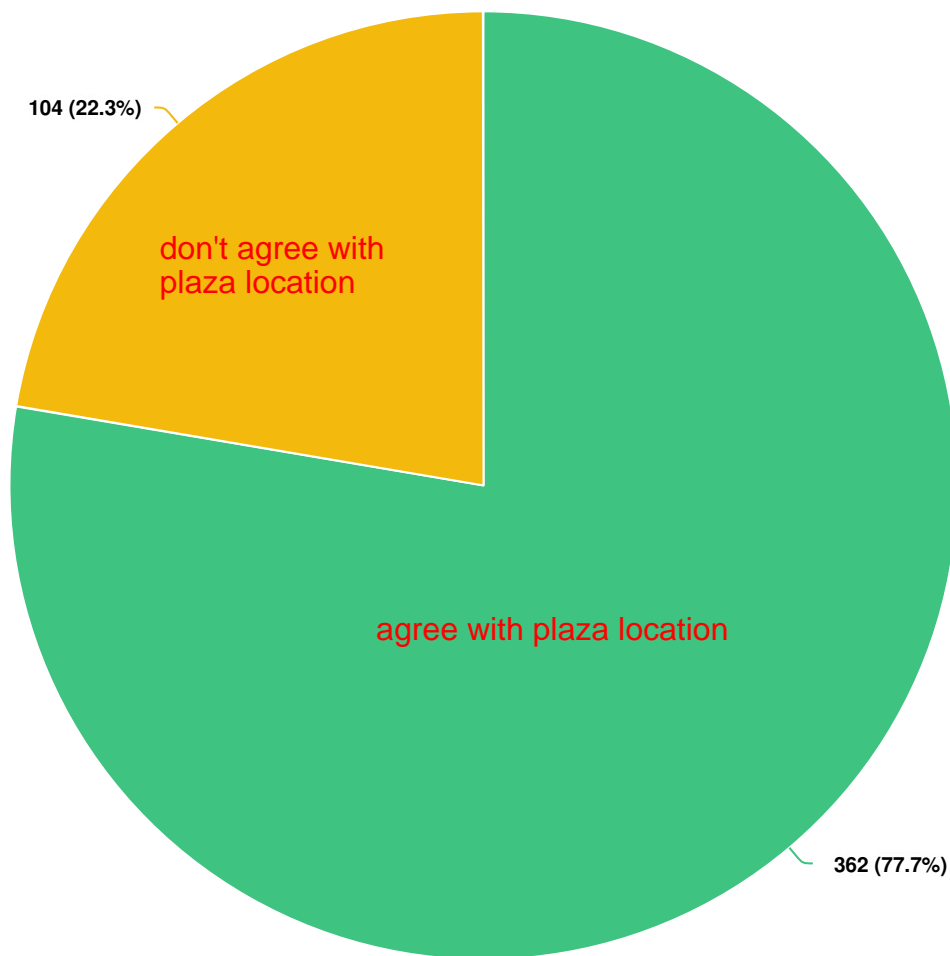

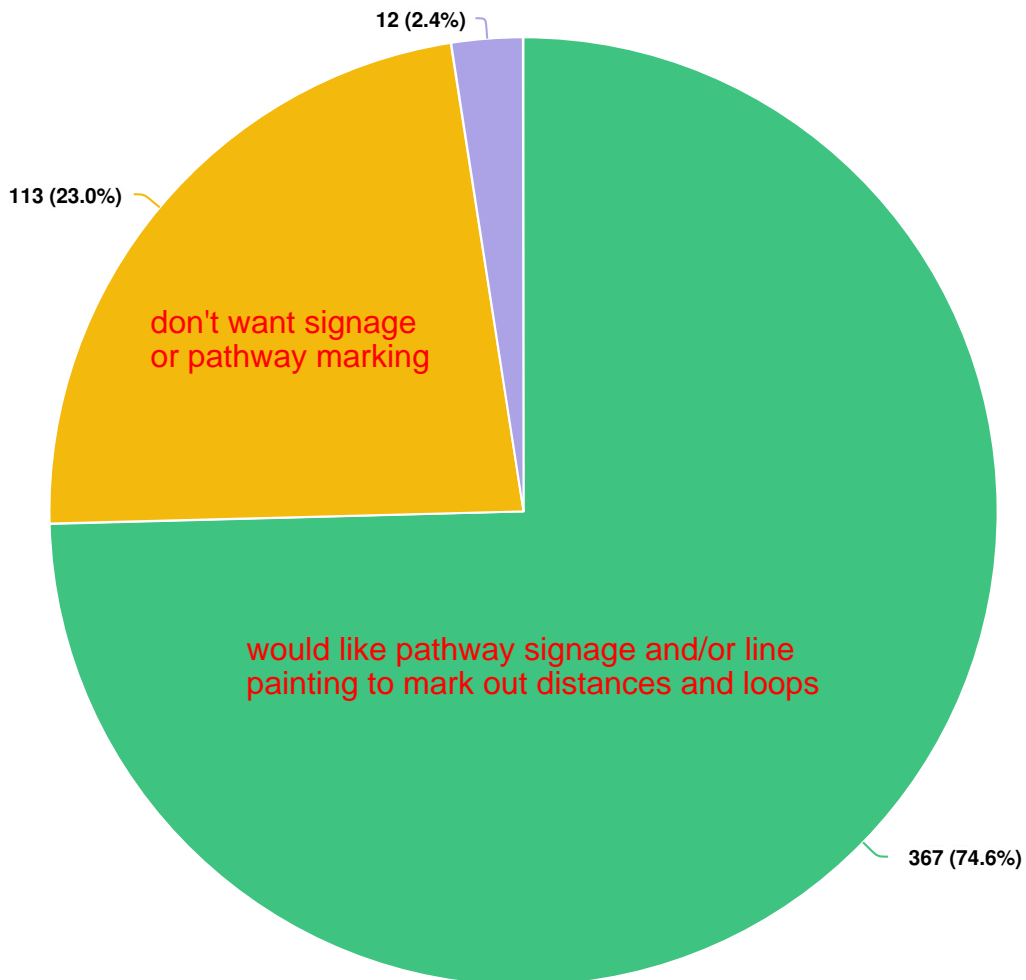

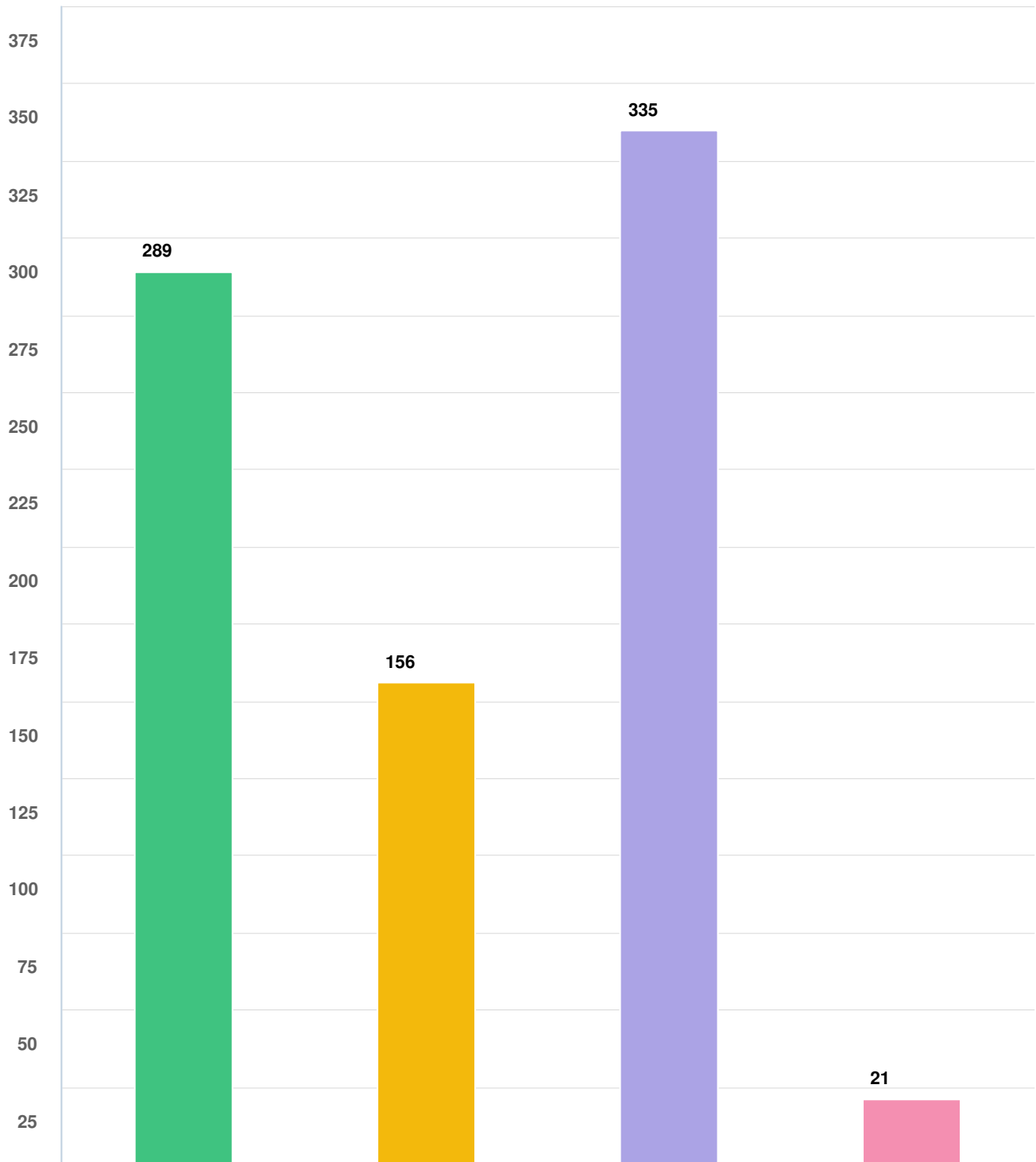

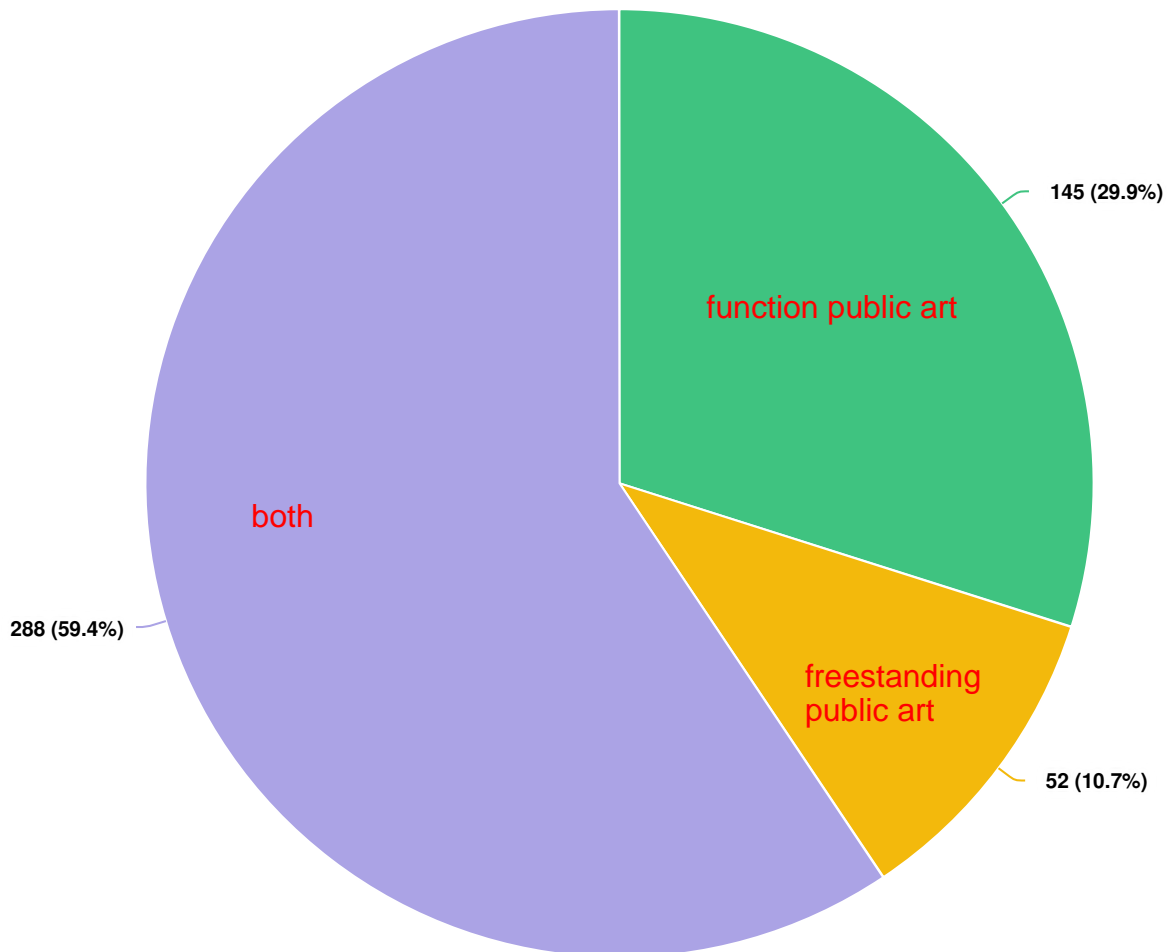

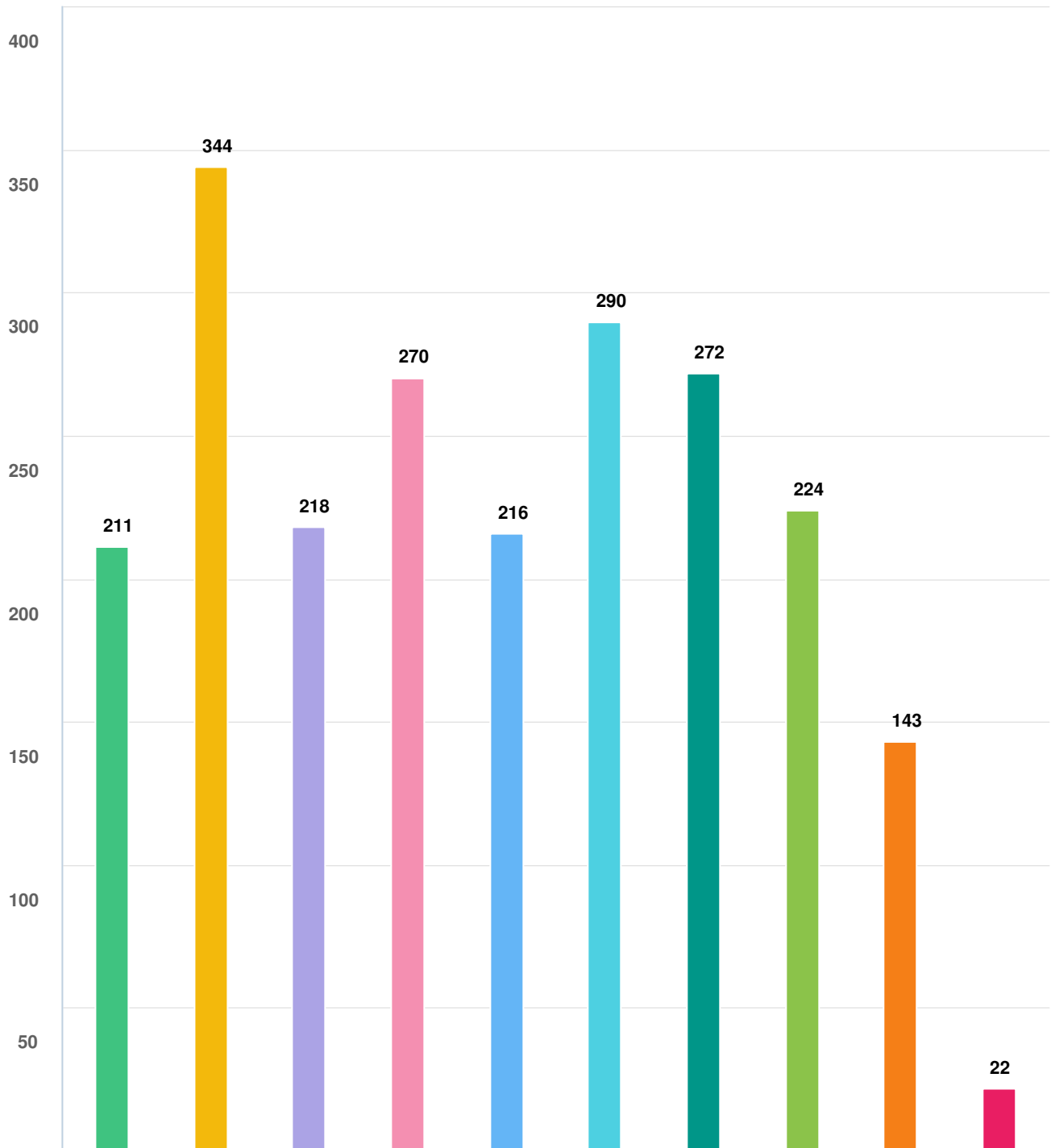

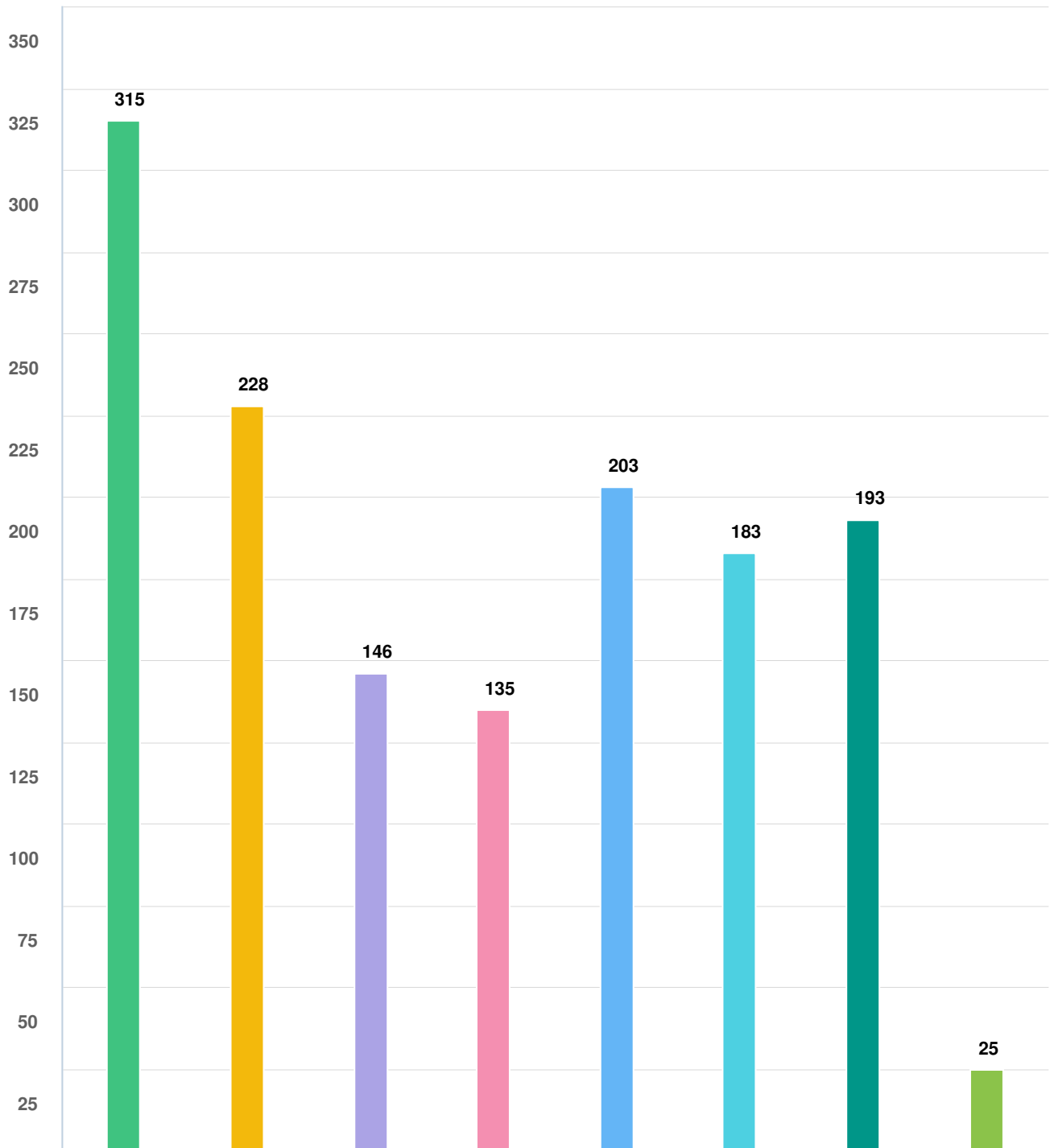

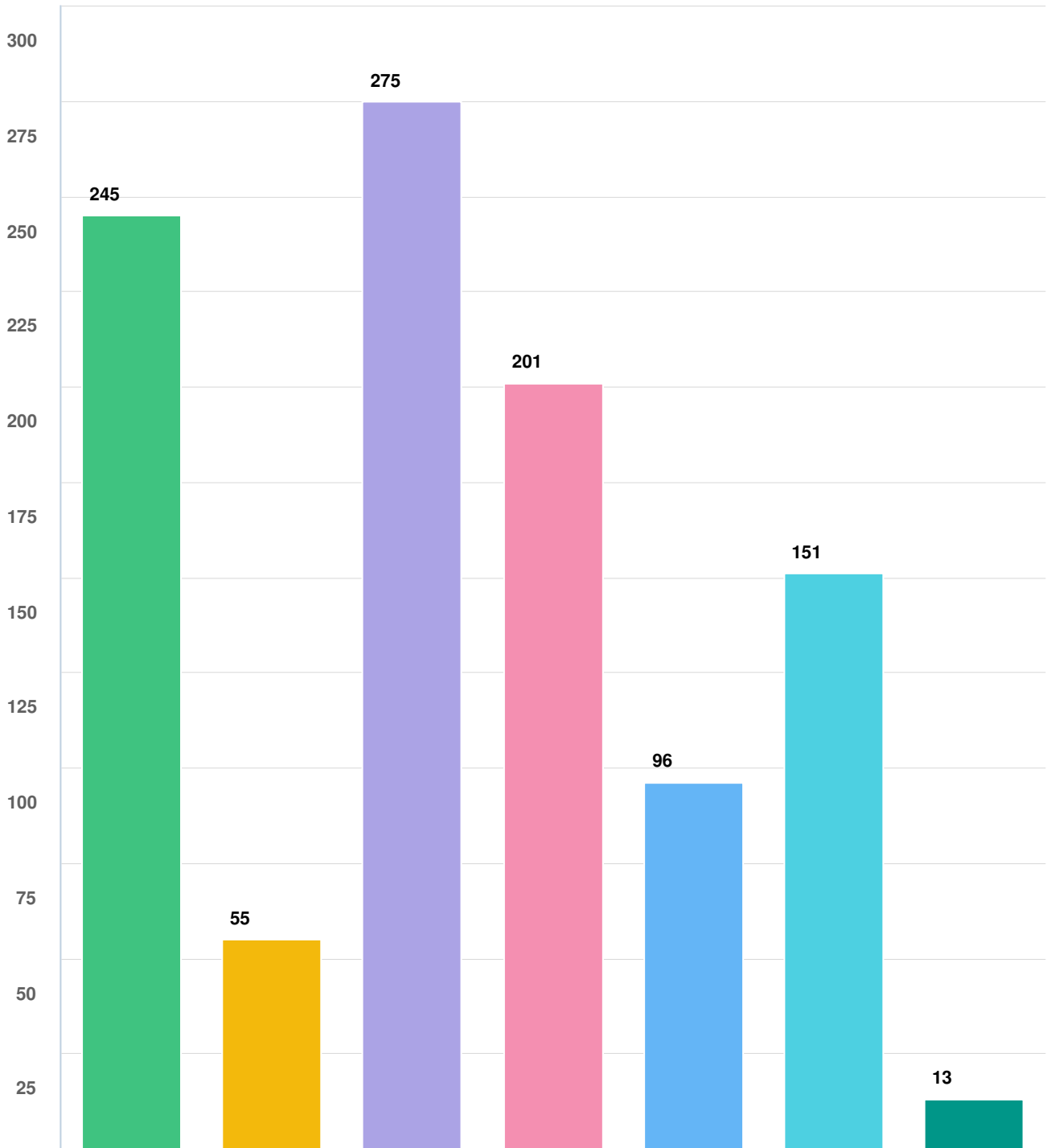

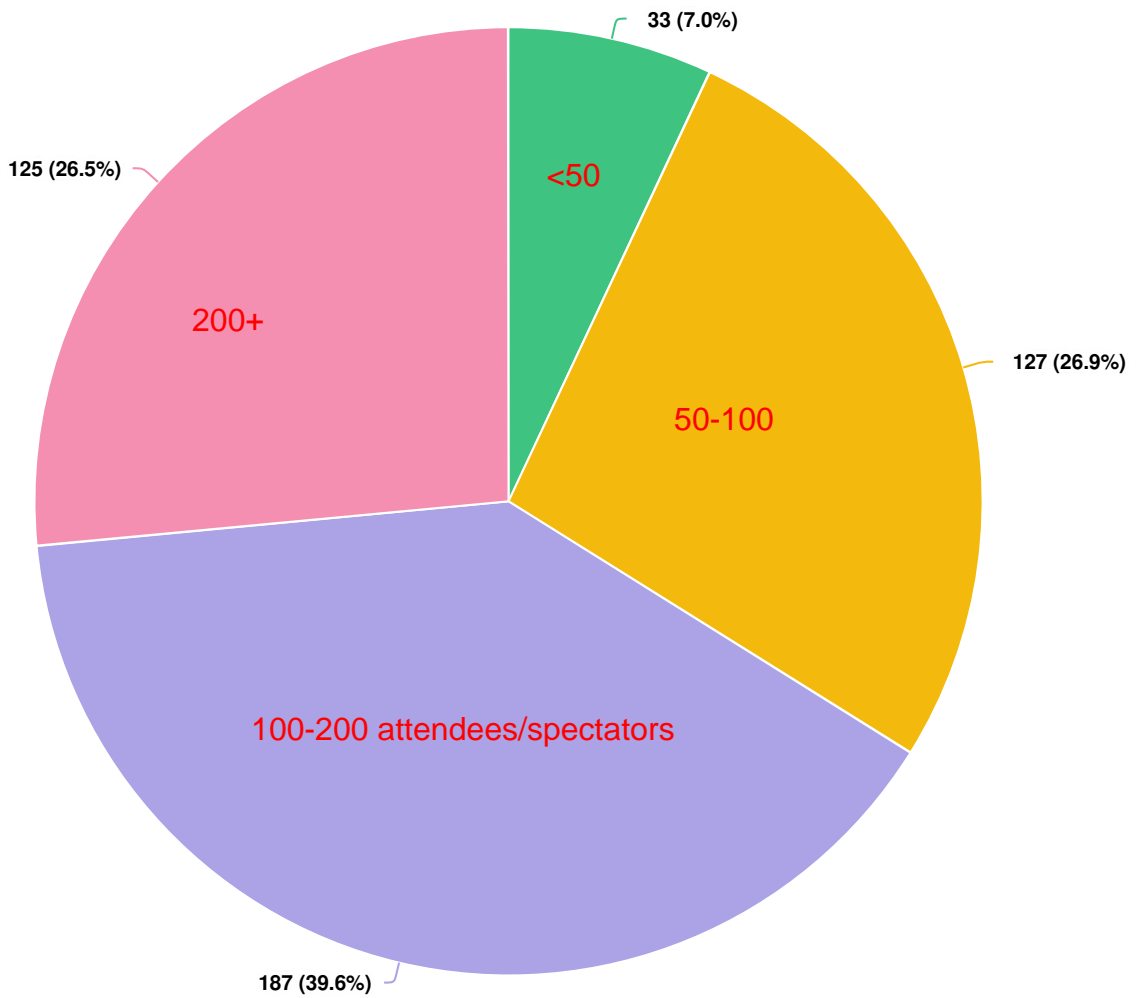

Q17 | How many attendees/spectators should the park be able to accommodate for events?

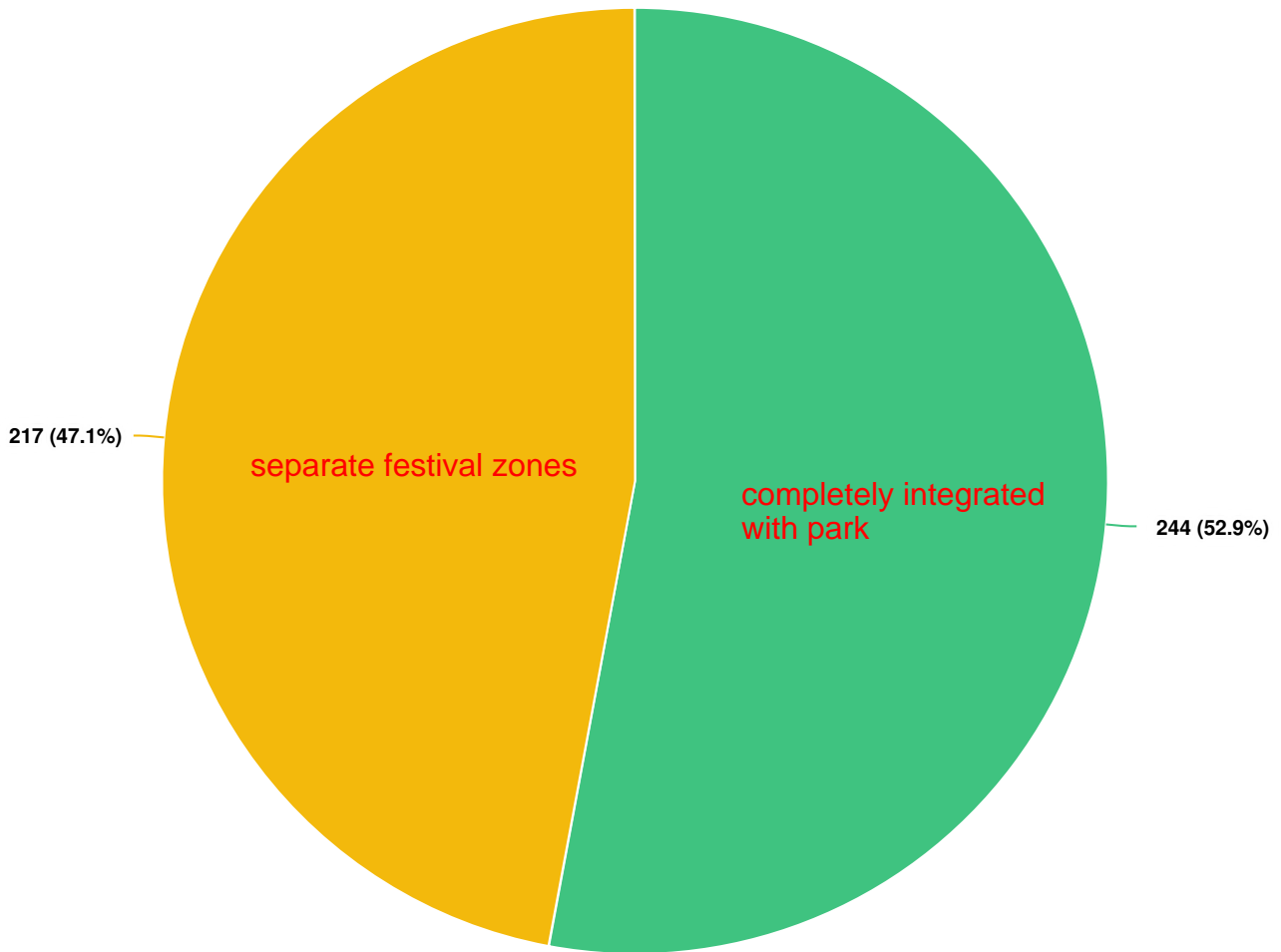
