Beyond simply enhancing the spectator experience, walk-up music provides our players with a brief respite from the pressures of the game, allowing them to enter the batter's box with confidence and enthusiasm.

Furthermore, walk-up music has become a commonplace feature in various sporting events, contributing to the overall ambiance and energy of the game. By granting us permission to play short music clips at an acceptable decibel level, you would be supporting our efforts to create a positive and memorable experience for all involved.

On average, each game would feature about 60 at-bats (combined for both teams), resulting in about 10 minutes of music played in short clips throughout the game. We are confident that this modest use of amplified music will enhance the overall atmosphere of our games without causing any disruption to the surrounding community.

We are committed to upholding the highest standards of conduct and ensuring that the use of walk-up music contributes positively to the youth softball and baseball experience in Halton Hills.
